


Support for Use of Natural Psilocybin Medicines

*Public Opinion Survey Conducted for
Bluestem*

October 2, 2025



Methodology

The survey was conducted with 1,504 Canadians from September 26 to October 1, 2025. A random sample of panelists were invited to complete the survey from a set of partner panels based on the Lucid exchange platform. These partners are typically double opt-in survey panels, blended to manage out potential skews in the data from a single source.

The margin of error for a comparable probability-based random sample of the same size is +/- 2.53%, 19 times out of 20.



The data were weighted according to census data to ensure that the sample matched Canada's population according to age, gender, and region. Totals may not add up to 100 due to rounding.





Do you support or oppose allowing the use of natural psilocybin medicines (commonly known as “magic mushrooms”) under medical supervision, for therapeutic purposes (for example, veterans, first responders and others receiving treatment for depression, addiction, PTSD, or end-of-life care)?

Half of Canadians support allowing the use of natural psilocybin medicines under medical supervision for therapeutic purposes in Canada with only 1 in 4 opposed.

Do you support or oppose allowing the use of natural psilocybin medicines (commonly known as “magic mushrooms”) under medical supervision, for therapeutic purposes (for example, veterans, first responders and others receiving treatment for depression, addiction, PTSD, or end-of-life care)?

Support for medical psilocybin is higher among younger Canadians, Atlantic residents and higher-income earners - opposition is stronger among older adults, CPC voters and Quebec residents.
